4. NEW BUSINESS

a. Oral update from the CEO of Retirement Services, Roberto L. Peña.

CEO Peña updated the Board on the following:

- The April 6, 2023 P&F Board meeting will likely be in person. The location of the meeting is still pending due to potential construction in the usual City Hall Wing Room meeting rooms. The meeting may be held at the ORS offices in the 5th Floor Boardroom.
- The annual Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) and Guaranteed Purchasing Power (GPP) will be applied to the P&F retirees' February pension payments.
- Medicare Part-B Reimbursement letters and forms are being mailed out to P&F retirees in February. Completed forms are due back to ORS by April 1, 2023.
- Retiree 1099-R's were mailed out to retirees by January 31st.
- The Quarterly Newsletter was emailed and mailed out to retirees last week.
- The vacant Senior Analyst position in Benefits has been filled. The new staff member came from the private sector and ORS is happy to welcome her.
- The office will be closed on Monday, February 20th in observance of the President's Day holiday.
- Trustees may have received an email form the City Clerk's Office regarding completing and submitting the Form 700. Staff asks that Trustees complete and submit the documentation to the City Clerk by the April 3rd deadline.

c. Educational Presentation and Discussion on Conflicts of Interest and Undue Influence by Fiduciary Counsel Reed Smith, LLP.

This Item was heard after item 5.3 and presented by Plan counsel Harvey Leiderman and Maytak Chin, with participation from the Board.

d. Oral update from Counsel on the resumption of in-person meetings.

Counsel Chin spoke to the item and answered questions from the Board. The Governor has given every indication of allowing AB 361 to lapse after February 28, 2023. The Board would be able to meet in March via Zoom, however, the April meeting will need to be in-person.

e. Discussion and action on factual findings for use of California Assembly Bill 361's abbreviated teleconferencing procedures.

Counsel Chin introduced and spoke to the item. Ms. Chin explained the contents of the memo submitted to the Board regarding evidentiary support for the Board's consideration of factual findings necessary for election to adopt AB 361's abbreviated teleconferencing procedures, which included:

- (1) Governor's proclamation on the continued state of emergency due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic; and
- (2) the City Council's recent resolution that continued to impose and recommend social distancing in City facilities.

A motion was made to adopt these as the Board's factual findings under AB361 and to authorize the Board to continue meeting virtually for the next 30 days.
